A CHANCE FOR HAWAIIAN TROOPS

One Battalion of Infantry will be Organized at Honolulu to Enter the United States Service.

SAN FRANCISCO, Aug. 3.—General Merriam, commanding the department of California, has received the following dispatch from Adjutan, General Corbin: "The president directs that if any of the military forces of the Hawaiian islands desire to become a part of your volunteer army that you organize not to exceed one battalion of infantry, nominating the officers and causing the officers and men to be mustered into the service and have them report to Colonel Barber for duty." The chamber of commerce of this city has received a letter from Admiral Dewey, thanking it for resolutions adopted in his honor, and expressing his pleasure that his work in the far East has contributed to the material welfare of San Francisco and the west coast of the United States.

INHABITANTS ARE STARVING

Terrible Condition of Affairs Reported in Havana--Sufferings of the Reconcentrados Worse Than Ever.

NEW YORK, Aug. 4.—A passenger who reached Sagua from Havana says affairs in the capital are growing worse. He said: "It is impossible to get beef at any price, and horse flesh costs \$1 per pound. Beans cost 28 cents a pound and are very bad at that. Eggs cost 35 cents each. The supply of condensed milk is practically exhausted, and the little left is sold for \$2 a can, such as you buy here for 10 cents. On an average ten to twelve persons are found dead of starvation in the streets every day, and this takes no account of the scores who daily die of hunger in the houses.

"No words can describe the horrors of Los Foscos, at the foot of the Prado, where reconcentrados are herded together. I was told there were 4000 of these miserable people in a place when I came away, and they are dying by hundreds, for of course nothing is being done for their relief, as the government has not enough food for its own soldiers. Worse than this, officials beat and abuse the reconcentrados shamefully."

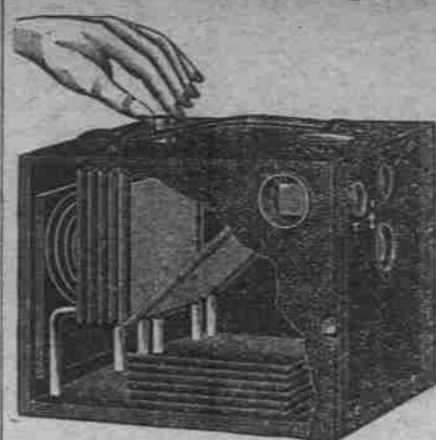

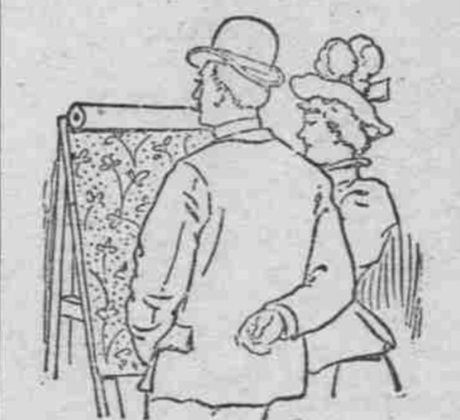
