Already he has struck a blow in return by publishing through the Associated Press, a confidential letter he had received from Roosevelt, asking that his Rough Riders be given active service in Puerto Rico. It is true in this letter Colonel Roosevelt made some indiscreet statements, but the indiscretions were prompted by patriotic zeal, and he would not have written in so frank a tone if he had suspected that his confidential communication would be published broadcast by Secretary Alger.

Algers's course in this matter has been contemptible. Roosevelt is a distinguished hero of the war, and the American people will not countenance Alger's petty warfare against him. Others have been as courageous upon the field of battle, but note has shown such magnificent moral courage.-Spokane Review.
