PEACE ASSURED.

The peace commissioners will sunburn and wind chafing. meet in Paris not later than the 1st of October, and after the preliminaries are settled they will enter upon the serious work of arranging the final terms regarding the Philippines. Spain, having been so signally de feated on land and water, and compelled to abandon Cuba and Porto Rico, will doubtless try her fine hand at circumventing the Americans in the way of diplomacy. She will endeaver to ring in some sort of a European combination, and there will be no end of citations from international law, of precedents innumerable, and possibly an attempt to fall back on the uti possidetis, or some other recondite subterfuge will be sprung to bewilder and confuse the innocent and unsuspecting Yankees.

Everything will turn on the construction of the article concerning the disposition to be made of the Philippine islands. The Spaniards will endeavor by all means to keep Notice of Final Settlement them, and will urge the incomplete conquest of the islands at the signing of the protocol, and that she has already surrendered more than America demanded at the beginning of the war.

The country is anxious for peace, and whatever terms the American commissioners agree to will almost certainly be accepted by the president and confirmed by the senate.

A renewal of hostilities will not be thought of, considering what we have gained. A few newspapers will go into tantrums over the result, but their yowling will have no more effect than had the hoarse bawling of John Hook at the close of the revolutionary war. So the great dailies those manufacturers of public opinion, should wade in now, and give the president and his commissioners an inkling of what the American people expect of them as to the outpeople expect of them as to the outcome of the negotiations. 
