



Notice is hereby given that the order of the President of January 31, 1898, permanently reserving the following described tracts or bareels of land, for the use of a boatrailway between The Dalles and Cellio, on the south side of the Columbia river, has been revoked. Said tracts described as follows: One tract situated in the NW4 of Sec. 31, T. 2 N., R. 14 E., containing about four and one-balf acres (no other description). The other tract in the NW4, Sec. 21, T. 2 N., R. 15 E., containing about one-half of an acre, particularly described as follows: Beginning at the northwest corner of said section 21, and running thence in a southerly direction along the west boundary line of said section 21, one hundred and seventy (170) feet to a point on said boundary line; thence in a straight line to a point on the north boundary line of said section 21, distant two hundred and sixty (200) feet in an easterly direction from the point of beginning; and thence in a westerly direction along the north boundary line of said section 21 to the point of beginning. Said tracts are therefore restored to the public domain, and are subject to disposal the same as other public lands. By order of the Hon. Commissioner. Dated at The Dalles, Oregon, August 19, 1898.
