PROF. NORTON'S IGNORANCE.

Professor Charles Eliot Norton, of Harvard university, gave another illustration recently of his ignorance of American history and his inability to understand American spirit and character.

Those who study American history know that we have not turned our back on old ideals or departed from the paths marked out by our forefathers.

The founders of the republic inaugurated the policy which brought countless benefits to the nation through George Rogers Clark's invasion of the Northwest, the occupation of Louisiana in 1797, the invasion and occupation of Oregon in 1805, the invasion and occupation of Florida at a later date, the conquest of California in 1842-44, the invasion of Mexico in 1846, intervention in Samoa in 1872, and in Hawaii in 1889.

In entering Cuba, Porto Rico, and the Philippines the United States is acting up to old ideals and in accordance with precedents that ever have contributed to the power and influence of the people.

SPELLING REFORM OBSTACLES

After struggling for a year or more with the vast and venerable question of the right spelling of English words, a committee of eminent educators has timidly suggested an improvement in the spelling of a dozen or so of notorious offenders against etymology and phonetics.

While the feeble proposition is made to spell a dozen or so easy words as they are pronounced, the pernicious influence of an effete aristocracy in England is corrupting the pronunciation of hundreds of other words, and the decree of a London fashion is absolute.

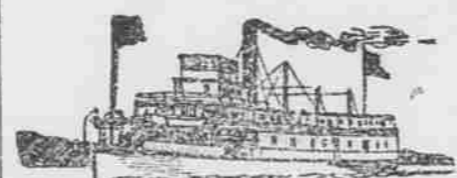

Notice is hereby given that the order of the President of January 31, 1898, permanently reserving the following described tracts or parcels of land, for the use of a boat-railway between The Dalles and Collio, on the south side of the Columbia river, has been revoked.

DEPARTMENT OF THE INTERIOR, General Land Office, Washington, D. C., May 27, 1898. Notice is hereby given of the following Executive Order, restoring certain lands in the Cascade Range Forest Reserve to settlement and entry: "EXECUTIVE MANEION, Washington, D. C., April 29, 1898. In accordance with the provisions of the Act of June 4, 1897 (30 Stat., 39), upon the recommendation of the Secretary of the Interior, the west half of Township one South, of Range ten East, Willamette Meridian, Oregon, within the limits of the Cascade Range Forest Reserve, is hereby ordered restored to the public domain after sixty days notice hereof, by publication, as required by law, it appearing that said tract is better adapted to agricultural than forest purposes. 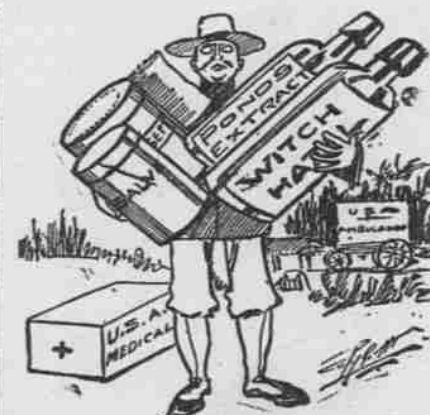
