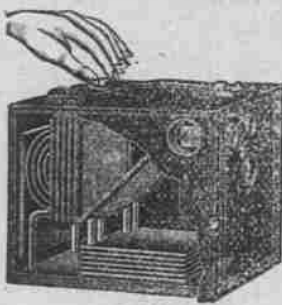
O. S. Paquet, of Wapinitia, is in the city.

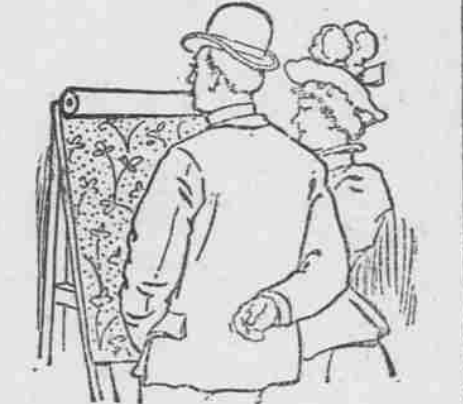
