MANIFEST WILL BE ISSUED

Leaders Intend to Formally Announce Their Plans in a Few Days-New Organization to be Known as the National Party.

NEW YORK, Sept. 9 .- The Times has the following:

city is engaged in the formation of a political party for Cuba, to be known as leaders have so far progressed that a meeting will be held today or tomorrow to select a committee of from 200 to 250 Cubans as a nucleus of organization. The movement is in the hands of T. Estrada Palma, Field G. Pierra, Horatio S. Reubens, and others who are wellknown. So far the plans have been kept quiet, but the Caban leaders will, within a few days, issue a manifesto setting forth their purposes and cause it to be widely distributed among their followers

According to Field G. Pierra, the principles of the new party will be based on the principles contained in the war resolutions of congress, passed on April 9, 1898. On explaining this and other features of the political scheme, Mr. Pierra

"Our intentions are in this movement to follow closely the desires of the American government and the laws laid down by it for the rehabilitation of Cuba. When once the preliminaries of the party organization are arranged, we shall send a committee of two or three to Cuba to undo political work that has already been started and that is in conflict with the ideas of the United States government.

"By this I mean that some of our people have already made arrangements to hold a town election in the province of Santiago de Cuba, the people to elect a governor in October, and we propose to see that this is stopped and no political machinery is put in motion in Cuba until, in the opinion of the American government, the Cuban people are ready for


