It will be well for Spain to remember that this is not the first time that America has taken part in a peace commission in Paris, and that it is no stranger to the hostile influences which may be exerted in that quarter. The treaty of 1783, by which England acknowledged the Independence of the United States, was framed in that city, and the anti-American influences on that occasion were far more powerful and dangerous there then than they can be now. Both France and Spain, our "allies" in the war just ended, tried in the peace treaty of 1783 to restrict the United States to the region east of the Alleghenies, so as to prevent this country from acquiring a power which might be dangerous to them in the future. The victories of George Rogers Clark, however, over the British in what is now Indiana and Illinois in the latter part of the revolution gave us claims which could not be set aside. England, our recent enemy, fairer than our treacherous friends, acceded to our demand that our Western boundary be fixed at the Mississippi. The United States, which secured justice when among

the feeblest of the world's nations, is not likely to fail now when it is one of the strongest.


