If there is a possibility of a continuance of the war the government cannot afford to muster out any more volunteers. The experience which they have had is invaluable because in it they have gained what can be gained in no other way. The troops that have been in camp or in the field for four months have passed through the most trying period of a soldier's life. Seasoned and trained as they are, they are worth to the government four times their number in green men. The government desires, of course, to reduce war expenses, but if there is a possibility that hostilities will be resumed it would be economy to keep the present volunteers in service or under orders, be paid on presentation at my office. and season and train them still Interest ceases on and after this date. further.

Many ridiculous complaints are made about garrison and patrol duty among the volunteers. Remaining in service through September and October will be no hardship to troops in camp in this country or in Porto Rico. Service through the winter months in Cuba will not be trying or dangerous. Every month's service adds to the value of the soldier, and from this time forward fewer mistakes will be made by officers and men. Even if there be no resumption of the war against Spain the extra sixty days' service or extr six months', as the case may be, will leave the volunteers much better for their experience tion creton effects at ordinary prices. in the army than they would be if discharged now. 




