

DONS MUST GET OUT OF CUBA NOW

The Administration Will Brook No Further Delay in Regard to the Evacuation of the Island.

PEREMPTORY MESSAGE SENT

American Commissioners Ordered to Act Quickly.

Spanish Sovereignty Must be Relinguished Immediately, In Accordance With the Terms Preecribed in the Protocol.

WASHINGTON, Sept. 23 .- A very peremptory message of instructions has been sent to the Cuban military commissioners, and is to be the base of a note to the Spanish commissioners. The the mine. authorities in Washington will not make public the terms of the note, but its general tenor is that the United States will not be satisfied with any further delay in the evacuation of Cuba.

Immediately following the explosion of gas there was a second explosion of fire damp.

There were 140 men in the mine at the time of the explosion. Of these, filtyeight in entries nine and ten. Four men, Said to Be Supplying Filipi-Jacobs, Davis, Walker and a Hungarian, were near the mouth of the entrance. The others were far in. When the explosion came these four men made a rush for the main landing, which they sucout to open air. Of the fifty-eight men in entries nine and ten, these four are the only ones known to be alive. Another body, that of Robert Davis, has been recovered, making eight dead. Nineteen miners are still unaccounted for. All who escaped are injured or burned either slightly or seriously.
