"The quotation in Pendleton today is 44% cents. This, as has been said on numerous occasions, is just 51/2 cents under what will be required to pull any wheat away from the grower, unless he becomes frightened and fears it is going Gold, Silver and Bronze Medals will be Awarded lower yet."


