Washington, Oct. 10.-The American commissioners have notified the Spanish authorities in Heyana that the United States will assume entire con-

trol, military and governmental, of Cuba. trol, military and governmental, of Cuba.

December 1st. The same control will be CONFERENCE exercised in Porto Rico October 18th.

This order was not intended to work a hardship to the Spanish troops or government, but it was thought best to definitely end Spanish rule and begin operations under the United States government by December 1st. It is expected to have the United States troops so stationed that there will be no need of


