We are asking no indemnity. This is treating Spain with more magnanimity than has been shown any defeated nation in modern times. In the war of 1871 France lost two of her most flourishing provinces and paid an indemnity of \$1,000,000,000. If no indemnity is exacted from Spain, and if the United States claims only the territory which she has conquered, there can be no question of our assuming any debt for any island.

There should be no delay in the evacuation of Cuba or Porto Rico. The United States owes it to the Cubans and the Porto Ricans to assume control as soon as possible. Waiting while Spain quibbles over minor conditions is simply an inducement to disorder and anarchy. It would serve the purpose of Spain to promote the rule of outlawry, but the United States is not interested in serving the purpose of Spain. She is pledged to establish order, to prevent outlawry, to give the people of all the conquered territory a stable government; and she must proceed to do this with reference to the people of Cuba and Porto Rico and the Philippines, and not with reference to the convenience of Spain. Clearness in the statement of the American purpose, firmness in exacting compliance with the instructions of this government, and repudiation of any pur-

pose to consider the possibility of Spain's unloading any debt upon us, constitute the policy which will bring to us most speedily a complete and lasting peace .- Inter Ocean.
