Two O. R. & N. Freight Trains Collide Causing a Disastrous Wreck. A rear-end collision between two O. R. & N. freight trains occurred at 8:20 o'clock yesterday morning in Portland under the bridge where Union avenue crosses Sullivan's gulch, on the East Side.
