FURTHER DELAY

Intimation of the Retention of the Phil uppine Islands by the United
is Made for the First Time.
${ }^{\text {L Londos, Oct. } 17 \text { - A dispateh to the }}$
London Newe Agency from Paris says:
"Today (Monday) the conference reached a crisis for the first time. Judge
Day presented the demands of the American commission in threatening words. He said that delay was the only possiole
object obtainable by the persistent efobject obtainable by the perristent
forts of the Spanieh commissoners saddle the United Stater with the Cu
ban debt, and would be tolerated n longer, as the United States would
neither assume nor guarantee any part of the debt.
"The Spaniards replied that thit placed Spain in a position of repudiating or of reducing the face value of the
Cuban bonds from 50 to 60 per cent,
paying only paying only half the stipulated intere
on the reduced value. Béfore they would adopt either alternative they would surrender to the United States the entire
Philippines. Philippines.
"Judge Day responded that the sur-
render of the Philippines woald probably be demanded, irrespective of the Cu
ban or any other debt.
"This, to the Spaniards, the first inti-
mation of the intentions of the United
States'as to the Philippines, resulted in
a whispered conference, followed, by a communicate with Madrid, Judge Day said that Preaident McKinley had in-
etructed him to demand the entire surrender of Porto Rico tomorrow, and the delivery of every town to the United
States officers before midnight, together with the evacuation of Havana on or be-
fore November 1, when the United States would be at the gates of the city ready to take possession.
"There was no alternative offered in the case of either of these demands, the session consequantly was very brief."
