A different situation to some extent exists in the Philippines, where it is practically certain we shall soon exercise full military control. Probably the Philippines will be ceded to us by the treaty adjustment. We are not pledged against assuming full sovereignty as soon as it can be arranged. The insurgent problem in the Philippines should not be difficult. It began in a fight for freedom from Spain, and that is assured. So are Republican institutions. If any of the Filippinos are fighting for Drug Co. power they will be disappointed. By the end of the year the American flag will be supreme in Cuba and the Philippines, as well as Porto Rico and Hawaii .. The year 1898 will go into the record as one of splendid expansion for the United States.
