BASIN OF THE PACIFIC.

Before our war with Spain Amerrean interests in the Pacific was confined to the slope. Now it covers what is called the basin. Every country which, from a maritime by Clarke & Falk. point of view, belongs to the Pacific, rather than to the Atlantic, is included in this basin.

More than one-half the total population is to be found in the Pacific area. Pacific North America has 11,2000,000 souls; Pacific Central America, 18,800,000, and Pacific South America, 10,000,000. These 30,000,000 Pacific Americans are distributed from Patagonia to Alaska. They are few in comparison with the teeming multitudes on the other side of the great ocean.
