The editorial writers whose specialty it is to draw invidious comparisons between morality under monarchy and immorality under a demoeracy are practically thrown ou of business. The less the British commoner is reminded of these things the better it is for the British commonwealth, and hence the subject of dis honesty under a democricy is a present deemed unworthy of notice. The worst phase of the situation from a monarchical view point is the fact that the more intelligent people of the United States bave never been associated as a class with the corru? tion alleged to be prevalent on this side of the Aullantic.
