Pakis, Nov. 4.-The Spanith commis-
sionere, in the conrse of a two hours seseion of the peace commisesion today,
fatly refused to accept Monday's proposition by the Americans to take the en-
tire group of the Pitilipines and to retire group of the Philippines and to re-
imburse Spain for her "pacific" expenditures there.
