On both points covered by continental Europe's forebodings the American people can make a very positive disclaimer. No alliance exists between the United States and Great Britain. The entrance of the United States in the politics of the world carries with it no menace of war. It is possible that there is an Candies, Nuts, understanding between the governments of the two nations on certain matters of foreign politics, but it is safe to say that if any such agreement exists it is in the vaguest and most general terms. It falls far short of what is understood in continental Europe by the term alliance. The United States would enter into no alliance except in actual war, and that compact would cover no exigencies except those occurring during that struggle or directly growing out of it. There is not the faintest probability that any conditions will arise at any time in the near future to make an alliance necessary or desireable. There is a certain sympathy and identity of interests existing bebeing known to all the world an alliance is not needed. The influence of the United States will be for peace,




