Americans Demand Cession of Philippines With Payment to Spain of $\$ 20,000,000$, One of the Carolines and Cable Rights in Other Islands -Must Be Complied With By the 28th of This Month.

Paris, Nov, 21.-The Spanieh and
American peace commissioners met in American peace commissioners met in
joint session at 2 c'clock this afternoon. the entire Philippine archipelago, and asked for a treaty cession of the islands. The Americans tendered to $\mathrm{Spain} \$ 20$,
