Meanwhile the United States had driven a strong discovery peg of its own. Spanish, Russian and British navigators had done little beyond coasting along the shores, of the great unknown land. In 1892 Captain Robert Gray sailed the Columbia across the bar of the great stream which now bears the name of his adventurous little ship, being the first to demonstrate the existence of the river. In the long controversy with England, the United States laid great stress on this undisputed fact.

Importance was also attached to the brilliant explorations of Lewis and Clarke, who commanded the government expedition sent overland in 1804 by President Jefferson. They ascended the Missouri river, crossed over the Rocky mountains, and followed the wild passes and wilder rivers to the sea.

Here were the links of discovery and exploration. To them was added the stronger link of occupation-first by the Astor Fur Company, with its posts at the mouth of the Columbia, on the Okanogan, and in the Spokane country.
