A crisis is at hand in the Anglo American conterense. press willingness or unwillingness to press willingness or unwillingness to
relinquish the inequitable treaty that denies us the right of a suitable war navv on the lakes, and that prohibits armed vessels in any lake port, even though the ocean be their ultimate
destination. It is Britam, not Canada, that is responsible for the ill treatment of the United States sailors and Britain that is responsible for the doings of the Canadian seal poachers. It is a behef in the certainty of Brit-
ish protection that encourages Canada ish protection that encourages Canada 1ngs with the United States. Britain at once will procced to be fair and just to the United States. If Canadn
alone were to be reckoned with, an her name would be demanded and enforced in shart order.
