OUR PERVASIVE PROSPERITY.

The commercial greatness of the United States is well illustrated by the rational conjecture that the commerce of New York during the year 1898 will exceed that of London from eight to twelve millions. But this statement, imposing as it is, conceals the greater and better part of the truth, which is this: Great as the increase of New York's commerce may be, it is an increase which is relatively slower than that of other parts of this country.

This country has oceans, or great lakes that ultimately will be connected with oceans, on every side of it. It has the advantages of both an insular and a continental territory. Vast plains, vast forests, mountains pregnant with precious metals, measureless areas of coal and iron, combine to afford support for millions of farmers, artificers, and traders.

The general increase of population involves a general participation in the increase of commercial profits. In 1870 the reports of the bureau of commerce and navigation gave Chicago no place as a city of exports; its imports were valued at \$735,894. During the first nine months of the present year the exports from Chicago were worth \$8,025,387, and its imports \$7,477,047.

But the most noteworthy point is the increase in the foreign trade of Chicago as compared with that of New York. In 1870 our foreign trade was worth only \$735,894, and it was only \$847,935, in 1880, while that of New York was worth \$417,663,559 and \$852,497,243 in the years named.

Baltimore, by no means a feverish city, has steadily increased her exports from \$14,510,733 in 1870 to \$76,245,870 in 1880, and to \$84,105,731 in the first nine months of this year. Galveston has about doubled her export trade between 1890 and 1898.

No part of this republic has cause for jealousy of another. The growth of trade in one section necessitates a growth of trade in all sections of the country. Not any part of this country, far less any city, can "dominate" the money market or the grain market. The seas and the lakes—those cheap and free highways of trade—

surround the land, great rivers connect our seas and lakes, the cheapest freight rates in the world make access to the seas and lakes easy; the genius of our people is inventive and expansive; all things work together for the common good.

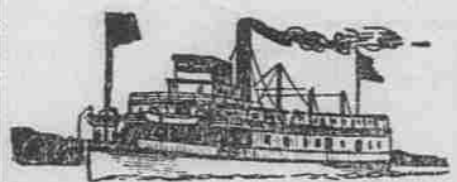

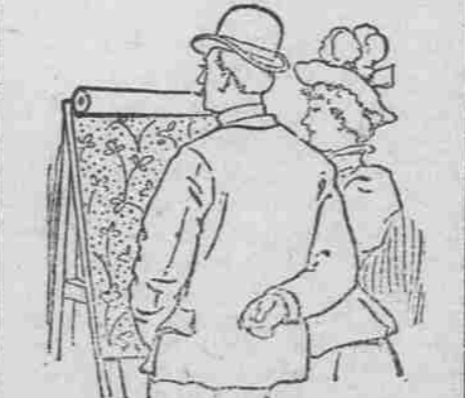

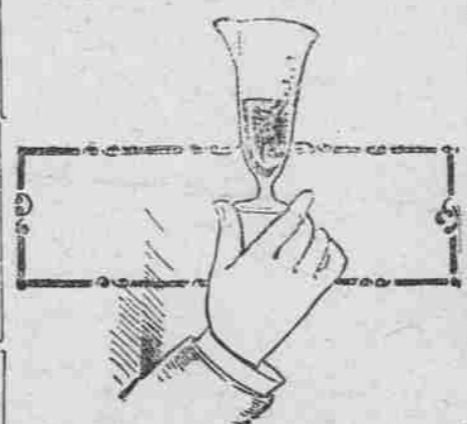
