ENGLAND NEEDS OUR FRIENDSHIP

We Need England's To Thwart the Kaiser's Schemes.

NEW YORK, Nov. 29.—A dispatch to the Times from London says: The Contemporary Review, issued tonight, contains a sensational anonymous article entitled "The Arch Enemy of England." This is the German emperor. The writer alleges that the kaiser seized Kiaochow by an agreement with Russia to prevent England from getting it, and that the Czar holds his present promise to vacate it when called upon, Russia providing Germany with coaling stations elsewhere.
The writer declares that the kaiser had drawn up a complete plan arranging for the naval superiority of France, Russia and Germany over England four years hence, when England is to be compelled to make humiliating terms throughout the world, leaving Germany the chief commercial colonial power.
All these plans have suddenly been thrown into confusion by the American-Spanish war, and America and England drawing together.

AMERICAN SILVER TRUSS.
Is Used by Many
Leading institutions throughout the United States and Canada, and have been adopted by Guy's and Westminster Hospitals, London, England. In this Truss the principle hitherto so greatly desired has at last been achieved, that of firmly and constantly holding the rupture with a gentle hand-like pressure.
It does not pass around the hip like other trusses, but over the hips, the silver wire lying in the hollow of the side, thereby allowing the free movement of the hips and limbs, allowing the wearer to stride out freely, and doing away with the fear and dread that something will go wrong that usually attends the wearing of other trusses.
Its lightness is featherweight in comparison with other trusses. It is so light the wearer scarcely knows he has anything on, and this is a great comfort, enabling the wearer to forget his ailments.
It can be altered by the wearer to the shape of the body, not being made of hardened steel, and can, with a little judicious and careful bending, be made stronger or weaker in pressure, as
