WASHINGTON. The latter properties are not the properties of church but of the people. This is the fact in all countries where there are established churches.

"The ecclesiastical situation, therefore, as it lies in many minds, is this:

"The church property in Porto Rico and the Philippines, being to a large extent the property of the state, is not rightly the property of the Roman Catholic church.
