SECTIONALISM GIVING WAY.

All the speeches at the Atlanta peace jubilee express a national sentiment and feeling of fraternity regardless of state lines such as the country never witnessed before on the same scale.

There is no reason why the old lines of past differences and dissensions should be perpetuated in our politics. They serve no good purpose and do not fit existing conditions.

Gen. Wheeler, in a speech at Atlanta, mentioned a fact that is often overlooked. He said the records of the civil war show that "the people of the slaveholding states were almost equally divided, those who fought under the stars and stripes of the union being fully equal in number to those who arrayed themselves under the stars and bars of the confederacy."

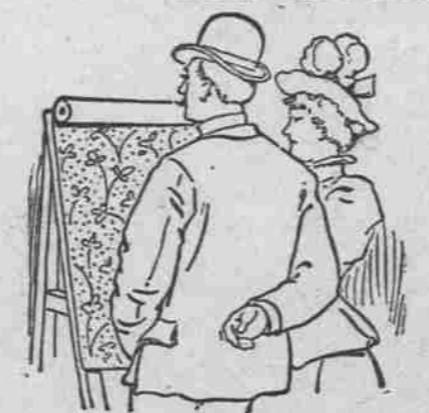

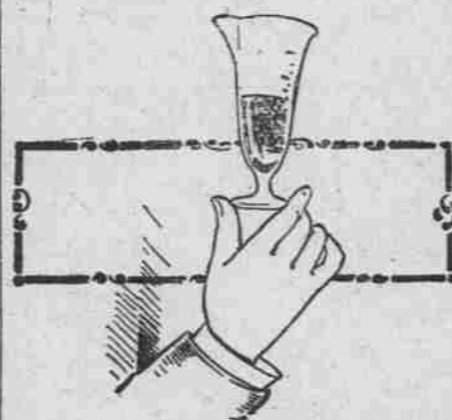
