## AMERICAN RULE WORKS SMOOTHLY

Cubans Well Pleased With New Conditions in Havana.

### REORGANIZATION UNDER WAY

Civil Administration Gets Firmly on Its Feet-Autonomists to Have No Representation in General Brooke's Cabinet.

NEW YORK, Jan. 3 .- A dispatch to the Tribune from Havana says: American rule in Cuba works smoothly. Generals Brooke and Ludlow are beginning the reorganization of the civil administrapleased. Part of the Spaniards are sullen, but the commercial classes are satisfied with the new regime.

The understanding is that no members of the former autonomist cabinet are to be included in General Brooke's proposed council of advisors. They are both elements.
