"It will be the duty of the commander of the forces of occupation to proclaim in the most public manner that we come, not as invaders nor conquerors, but as friends, to protect the natives in their homes, in their employments and in their personal and religious rights. "While the control of all public property and revenues passes without cession, and while use and management of all public means of transportation are necessarily reserved to the authority of the United States, private property, which belongs to individuals or corporations, is to be respected except for good and sufficient cause fully estab-

"Taxes and duties heretofore payable by the inhabitants to the late government, become payable to the authorities of the United States unless it be seen fit to substitute for them other reasonable rates or modes of contribution to the expenses of the government, whether general or local.

"If private property be taken for military use it shall be paid for when possible in cash at a fair valuation, and ble receipts are to be given.

#### THE DEATH OF CAPT. MURPHY

Died Suddenly in Portland of Brain Fever-He Went there to Stand Trial.

PORTLAND, Jan. 5 .- Captain Edward Murphy, late of the American ship George Stetsen, died at 8:20 this morning at the Quimby house on First and Madison streets, of brain fever.

He, in company with his former mate George Harvey, left San Francisco last eek, on the steamship Columbia, and overheated himself. While profusely perspiring he engaged in conversation with the master of the Columbia on the bridge of the steamship, where he contracted a cold. From this it is supposed arose his fatal illness.
