**Congregational Church Meeting.**

The members of the church and congregation of the Congregational church held their annual meeting last evening, at which there was a large attendance. Reports of the clerk and treasurer were presented, showing a prosperous condition both as to membership and finances.

The church is now clear of all indebtedness, with the exception of a small balance—less than one hundred dollars—and the church property is now clear of all incumbrances. On motion of S. L. Brooks the trustees were instructed to increase the salary of the pastor from \$3,000 to \$1,200 per annum, provided the pledged financial support for the year shall aggregate \$10,000.

The following officers were elected: Deacons, S. L. Brooks, A. R. Thompson, J. M. Huntington and J. M. Patterson; Deaconess, Mrs. D. J. Cooper; Trustees, S. L. Brooks; Clerk, A. R. Thompson and Treasurer, B. S. Huntington.

At the close of the meeting those present subscribed about \$750 toward the current expenses of the church, and it is expected this will be increased to over a \$1,000 within a few days.

One of the trustees announced that the matter of building a parsonage was under consideration and might be undertaken within the coming year.

After the business meeting the ladies served refreshments and an hour or more was pleasantly given to sociability and music.

**Oregon's New Governor.**
