Military government is mevitable for a time when a country changes hands, and this presupposes a military governor. In fact, the Filipinos are showing an ignorance of the requirements of the position in which the United States and themselves are placed which proves that they have much to learn before they can safely be placed in charge of their local affairs. The military government will be established all over the islands, and the duration of this regime will depend largely on the tractability and sanity of the Filipinos in conforming Phone 6, to that government's requirements.




