### FOUND WANTING.

Composed Principally of Kicking on the Stage—and in the Audience.

There were many features beside that of the boy "Wanted" in the play Saturday night. As is the case with the majority of plays put upon the stage (and we are sorry to say, demanded), in this enlightened (?) age, there was wanting an air of refinement which was conspicuous for its absence in the "Boy Wanted," and in fact most of the actors of the play. While one can scarcely say of these productions that they are indecent, yet they border so closely on the forbidden that a refined audience becomes really nauseated before the curtain falls. In the first act the leading soubrette (who by the way was not present on this occasion) kicks. In the second act the second lady (?) kicks a little higher. In the third act the entire company of beautiful, well-formed, rare old hand-painted relics of former greatness, touch the ceiling, and the audience is delighted, while some mother who has misjudged the play and taken her sweet little daughter, is heard to remark: "Now, dearie, there's nothing modest in that at all. I wish we had remained at home."

The absence of plot in these productions is sadly missed. However, this could be overlooked, if as in the "Dazzler" there is some merit—good singing, good dancing, or even a pretty girl or two. Instead there is nothing but a conglomerated mass of nothing but child's play. By way of a slight variation the "boy wanted" made his appearance between acts and made a sign-board of himself, much to the disgust of the audience.

However, we have been speaking in general terms. To say that there was not a redeeming feature in the play would be an injustice. The fault is mostly in the play. The lack of an opportunity to display the talent which may be possessed by the actors. The musical selections by the old German were like an oasis in a desert, and well executed. The tumbling of the two young girls was good; but the star of the evening was the tragedian, who did some good acting and his comedy piano specialties were well received.

The difficulty encountered in determining the merit of a play before its production seems unremovable. It is misrepresented to the manager, who also becomes discouraged in bringing to the city actors of merit like Ward, Effie Ellsler, Milton Nobles, and others, who are almost sure to be given an icy reception, while plays of the Saturday night caliber draw crowded houses.

The newspapers advertise such shows from copy furnished by the advance agents, placing stars as a credit, and the only authority we have for other mention are the papers of other cities, and we are about coming to the conclusion that the Valley papers are bribed, as the Oregonian, Statesman and many others so often speak well of meretricious productions.
