A NEW RAILROAD

An Iowa Syndicate Proposes to Build It Via Copper River.

IS ASKED FOR

MEASURE Company is Capitalized at Thirty Millions and Asks the United States to Advance to It \$16,000 for Each Mile of Railroad Built, Construction to be Under Direct Charge of Secretary of the Interior.

> New York, Jan. 30 .- A dispatch to the Herald says:

Several Iowa men have asked congress. to grant a subsidy of \$16,000 a mile for a railway and telegraph line to the Klondike. Representative Cartis, of Iowa,into carry out the wishes of the syndicate.

This syndicate has organized the Copper River & Yukon Railroad Company, and they ask congress to grant them Mr. J. E. Lilly, a prominent citizen izing the appointment into the service the right to incorporate for fifty years, to give them right of way for the railroad and telegraph line from Valdes inlet, Alaska, over this route east and northeast through the pass and along the mountains, north and east to the Copper River bottoms and thence up the west bank of the river to the Slahana river and Matasta lake; thence through Matasta pass and east to the little Tokio river and thence down the left branch and up the right and thence southwest to and up Copper creek as far as the copper mines extend.

It is provided that a branch line shall be built from some point east of Mantas ta pass down some stream to the Yukon river to the Canadian boundary.


