The success perseverance, ability and energy to develop with their own muscle and money-small though the supply of the latter was-the mineral and agricultural resources of the region at a time when eastern capital was hiding in the vaults of the east. What put Seattle ahead of other little milling ports on Puget sound was not her location, for the great barbor of the Sound offers many another such choice location for a large port, but the fact that the people of the little village in the 70s banded themselves together, built with their own hands a grade for a railway to the adjacent coal fields, went into their own purses and subscribed a sum sufficient to purchase in the east a shipload of rails, built the road and thus made Seattle a railroad town. 
