at a mine does not do well, because it has only one kiln of ore to treat, and so metals for floxing mast be brought from distant mines at considerable expense. Besides thie, colke is always more ava able near a large city.
"One ore may contain lead and
anather iron. These different ores fro mines situated far apart, can be used to flux each other," said Mr. Chase. "I
do not think a large smelter need be located close to the mining regions. The Omaha smeltar has no mines within
