"And yet," declared Senator Hale, "we are told that we are traitors and held up to ridicule in the newspapers because we want to give those people a chance at least to show that they are friendly and can set up a government of their own. Instead we kill them, not by scores, not by hundreds, but by thousands. More Filipinos have been killed by the guns of our army and navy than were patriots army and navy than were patriots killed in any six battles of the revolutionary war. It has become a gigantic event. The slaughter of people in no way equal to us, meeting us with bows and arrows, and crawling into jungles by hundreds, there to die, has stupefied the American mind. No one has said that our mission of commerce and of the gospel was to commerce and of the gospel was to be preceded by the slaughter of thousands of persons."


