## ONE BATTALION LEFT IN THE CITY

Intense and Increasing.

Manila, Feb. 19 .- 3 p. m .- The California volunteers abandoned the Gua daloupe church at 5 o'clock this morning, which has since been set on fire, and retired to San Pedro Macati. The rebels still hold the country in the vicinity of Guadaleupe, Pasig and Patero, despite the efforts of the gunboats to dislodge them from the jungles on both sides of the river.


