**Minnesota's Ancient Rocks.**  
Prof. Winchell, of Minneapolis, considers the greenstone of Minnesota the oldest known rock, and as representing the original crust of the earth. The lower series of it is purely igneous, the upper, or "clastic," series consists of greenstone, more silicious rocks and conglomerates, more or less altered by heat. Hitherto it has been supposed that the Laurentian granite and igneous rocks of Canada were the oldest rocks. The silica and potash of the upper greenstones of Minnesota bespeak, he thinks, a primeval alkaline ocean with silica in solution. From this ocean comes the great stock of the world's potash in the Archaean rocks.—*London Globe.*
