Conference on the River and Harbor Bill Will Probably Seitle the Matter.

## **NEW PROPOSI-**TION BROACHED

Investigation of Both the Nicaragua and Panama Routes Is Contemplated, Arter Which the Secretary of War Is to Go Ahead With the Work.

Washington, March 2 .- The indications from the conference on the river and harbor appropriation bill are that a compromise on the Nicaragus canal amendment will be agreed to.

One of the recent propositions made and being discussed is for an appropriation of \$500,000 with authorization of the president to investigate both the Panama and Nicaragus canals and when the best route is found, the secretary of war is to go ahead with the work and enter into contract for its completion.

It seems to have been determined that some canal legislation will be passed.
