The Cuban Military Assembly's Action Regarding Him.

HAVANA, Cuba, March 11 .- The Cuban military assembly, in public session this afternoon, impeached General Maximo Gomez and removed him from his command as general-in-chief of the Cuban army, the first ballot resulting in twenty-six votes being cast in support of the motion to impeach and remove General Gomez, against four in opposition. The original motion provided for the abolition of the grade of general-in-chief, but an amendment was offered to this by Senor Aguerro, which

NEW YORK, March 11 .- The United States transport Meade sailed today for Havana. She has on board \$3,000,000


