

D. 1899, notice is hereby given that the Common Council aforesaid will cause to be constructed, in accordance with the laws pertaining thereto, a sewer system in and for said city; the nature, extent and location of said system is hereinafter set forth; and the cost thereof will be charged to the property benefited thereby.
