R. & N. from the Great Northern, and these came through last night.

Although their tickets were good to Portland, about twenty stopped off at The Dalles, with the intention of settling in different parts of the interior. For instance five signified their intention of going to Bickelton, Wash., two to Mitchell and three to Antelope; several board ed the boat for Lyle this morning ; while others remained in The Dalles, and are undecided as to what move to make. 


