PAY YOUR ROAD TAX.

Councilmen Discuss Many Important Questions Regarding Our Welfare.

The regular council meeting last night was held at the council chambers, with M. J. Nolan presiding and Councilmen Kuck, Keller, Clough, Johns, Gunning, Stephens, Michelbach and Johnston present.

After a slight correction in the minutes of the last regular meeting and those of the special meeting on March 7th, they were approved. Kuck, of the finance committee, reported that W. S. Myers had been employed as collector of road tax.

Johnston, of the committee on streets and public property, reported that the committee had repaired the street on the west side of Mill creek bridge on Fourth street.

Communication was read from the Acetylene Gas Co., proposing to sell lamps for lighting the streets of the city, and refer to the committee on streets and public property.

The remonstrance of J. W. Condon and others against running the sewer through their property was referred to the sewer committee.

The matter of locating the city boundary line was referred to the committee on streets and public property.

A bill of Dufur & Menefee for the amount of \$165, for legal services in the case of J. C. Baldwin against Dalles City, which was won by the city in the circuit court, was referred to the finance committee.

The council authorized the finance committee to loan out a balance of \$575 of the sinking fund to anyone wishing it and furnishing good security.

After a motion by Stephens to adjourn to meet at 8 o'clock on April 11th, for further consideration of the sewer question, the following claims were read and ordered paid:

To whom it may concern: By virtue of an order, made by the Common Council of Dalles City, Oregon, on the 7th day of March, A. D. 1890, notice is hereby given that the Common Council aforesaid will cause to be constructed, in accordance with the laws pertaining thereto, a sewer system in and for said city, the nature, extent and location of said system is hereinafter set forth: and the cost there-of will be charged to the property benefited thereby.

That all of said sewers are to be of terra cotta pipe and of such sizes as may be hereafter determined by said Council.

First—A main sewer commencing from the low water mark on the Columbia river at the foot of Union street, thence running south on Union street to the intersection of the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets with Union street, thence south on Union street to the intersection of Tenth and Union streets.

Second—A main sewer commencing at and connected with the sewer at the intersection of the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets with Union street, thence running easterly, through private property in block 10, thence easterly through the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets to Washington street, thence south on Washington street to Laughlin street.

Third—A sewer commencing at and connected with the sewer at the intersection of the alley between First and Second streets with Union street, thence running easterly through said alley to Madison street, thence easterly through Madison street to the intersection of Third and Madison streets, thence easterly on Third street to the intersection of Third and Monroe streets.

Fourth—A sewer commencing at and connected with the sewer at the intersection of the alley between First and Second streets with Union street, thence running easterly through said alley to Jefferson street, thence north on Jefferson street about 100 feet, thence easterly to a point in the middle of Taylor street about 130 feet north of the north side of the intersection of Taylor and Second streets.

Fifth—A sewer commencing at the intersection of the alley between Second and Third streets with Taylor street, thence westerly on said alley to Monroe street, thence north to connect with sewer in alley between First and Second streets.

Tenth—A sewer commencing at and connected with sewer on Union street at the intersection of the alley between Third and Fourth streets with Union street, thence easterly through said alley to the intersection of said alley with Washington street.

Eleventh—A sewer commencing at and connected with sewer on Union street at the intersection of the alley between Third and Fourth streets with Union street, thence easterly through said alley to the intersection of said alley with Washington street.

Twelfth—A sewer commencing at and connected with sewer on Union street at the intersection of the alley between Second and Third streets with Union street, thence easterly through said alley to the intersection of said alley with Washington street.

Thirteenth—A sewer commencing at and connected with the sewer on Union street at the intersection of the alley between Third and Fourth streets with Union street, thence easterly through said alley to the intersection of said alley with Washington street.

Fourteenth—A sewer commencing at and connected with the sewer on Union street at the intersection of the alley between Third and Fourth streets with Union street, thence easterly through said alley to the intersection of said alley with Washington street.
