UNCLE SAN'S INTENTIONS

Textion the Proclamation Issued by the Philippine Commission at Manila.

TONE CONCILIA-TORY BUT FIRM

Philippine People Will be Granted the Most Ample Self-Government Reconcilable With a Stable Admiristration of Public Affairs.

NEW YORK, April 4 .- The Journal's Manila correspondent cables the text of the United States Philippine commissoners' proclamation, issued today. It follows:

The commission desires to assure the people of the islands of the cordial good will and fraternal feeling which is entertained for them by the president and the Co., Marshall, Mich. American people. The present aim and object of the United States, apart from fulfillment of the solemn obligations it has assumed toward the family of nations by its acceptence of sovereignty over the Philippine islands, is the wellbeing, prosperity and happiness of the Philippine people, and their elevation and advancement to a position among the most civilized people of the world.

The president believes this felicity and perfection of the Philippine people is to be brought about by the assurance of peace and order, by guarantee of civil and religious liberty, by establishment of the justice, cultivation of letters, science and liberal and practical arts, by enlargement of intercourse with foreign nations, expansion of industrial pursuits. by trade and commerce, by multiplication and improvements of means of graph to Captain Abercrombie to take




