To whom it may concern: By virtue of an order made by the Common Council of Dalles City, Oregon, on the 7th day of March, A. D. 1895, notice is hereby given that the Common Council aforesaid will cause to be constructed, in accordance with the laws pertaining thereto, a sewer system in and for said city, the nature, extent and location of said system is described as follows: and the cost thereof will be charged to the property benefited thereby.

That all of said sewers are to be of terra cotta pipe of such size as may be hereafter determined by said Council.
