ROSEBURG, Or., April 8 .- Hollister D. McGuire, fish commissioner of Oregon, and A. W. Reed, state senator from Douglas county, were drowned in the North Umpqua river, opposite Riverdale farm, six miles below Roseburg, this morning. The bodies have not been recovered.

When about half way to shore, Hubbard looked over his shoulder and saw McGuire ewimming after him and Reed upon the boat. When he reached the shore he looked again, and both had dissappeared. Neither has yet been found. Searching parties are out with ropes, lanterns and grappling hooks.

Aged Jurist Cannot Live Many Hours Longer.

CAUGHT COLD TWO WEEKS AGO

Became Complicated With Trouble Resulting From Extreme Old Age-Health Has been Failing.

Washington, April 9.—Ex-Justice of the Supreme Court Stephen J. Field is the Supreme Court Stephen J. Field is dying. His physician does not expect him to survive the night.

Judge Field contracted a cold about cated a week ago last Thursday with troubles resulting from extreme old age. Saturday morning his physician, Dr. Curtis, pronounced his case critical, and all during the day and night he has been gradually sinking.

About 2 o'clock this morning he was momentarily expected.

Judge Field is over 82 years of age. Since he retired from the supreme court in 1897, atter 34 years of service, his condition has several times alarmed his friends, but his wonderful vitality has overcome all the disabilities of age, and though feeble of late years, he has since his retirement, enjoyed fairly good health. At the time of his retirement he had been in bad health for some time, but his ambition to serve upon the supreme beach longer than Chief Justice Marshall induced him to refuse retirement, although long past the legal age, until after his term had exceeded that of the first chief justice.
