School District No. 5 of Wasco County, Oregon, will issue two coupon bonds of the par value of four hundred dollars each bearing interest at the rate of six per cent per annum, interest payable semi-annually; said bonds being redeemable at the pleasure of said district after ten years from their date, but due and payable absolutely twenty years from date. Principle and interest payable at the office of the Treasurer of Wasco County, Oregon, or at such place as may be designated at the option of the purchaser.
