D. 1899, notice is hereby given that the Common Council aforesaid will cause to be constructed, in accordance with the laws pertaining thereby, a sewer system in and for said city; the nature, extent and location of said system is hereinafter set forth; and the cost thereof will be charged to the property benefited thereby.

That all of said sewers are to be of terra cotta pipe and of such sizes as may be hereafter de-termined by said Council.

First—A main sewer, commencing from the low water mark on the Columbia river at the foot of Union street, thence running south on Union street to the intersection of the alley between Fourth and Fifth streets with Union street to the intersection of Tenth and Union street to the intersection of Tenth and Union streets.
