The Bunker Hill and Sullivan Mill Blown Up at Wardner.

ONE DEAD AN-OTHER WOUNDED

Property Worth \$250,000 to \$300,000 Shattered-Train Seized by a Mob of 800 or 1000.

SPOKANE, April 29 .- A Wardner special to the Spokeman-Review says:

Wardner today has been the scene of the worst riots since the deadly labor war of 1892. One man is dead, another is thought to be mortally wounded, and property valued at \$250,000 has been destroyed by giant powder and fire. MANILA, April 29 .- 3 p. m .- The conference today between Otis and Colonel Manuel Aguelezes and Lieutenant Jose Bernal, who came from General Luna under a flag of truce vesterday to ask for a cessation of hostilities, were fruitless, It is understood the Filipino commissioners were given the terms upon which the Americans will consent to negotiate.
