TO PURGE THE DISTRICT.

Drastic measures are being taken by the state officials of Idaho, under cover of martial law, to settle on a basis of lasting peace the questions that have twice entailed federal troops to the Wardner mining district for the preservation of life and property, says the Oregonian. The plan, briefly, is to purge the district, and thereby the state of Idaho, of the lawless element that has long been in control of the Miners' Association. The measure is harsh, and under other circumstances and in other places would justly be denounced as tyrannical to an unbearable degree. With the history of the troubles in the Wardner mining district behind it, however, and the manifest impossibility to work the mines under the domination of the lawless element in control of the union, the measure stands not only for the industrial development of the district, but for the safety of life and property therein. It is, as all experience has shown, utterly useless to temporize with lawlessness. While it is probable that mine owners in the Wardner district slighted, in the earlier stages of the controversy between themselves and their employes, the opportunity to make the men friendly instead of antagonistic to their interests, it is folly to suppose that such opportunity now exists or can be recalled. In justice, therefore, to all concerned—the men who own the mills, the men whose capital is their labor, the local authorities, charged with the duty of keeping the peace, and the federal authorities that have twice been levied upon at great expense to command the peace—it will be well to enforce such measures as will compel disturbing and defiant miners to seek work elsewhere.

A great gathering of newspaper men from all parts of the country is to take place in Portland in July. Portland is preparing to make the most of this opportunity, and will do much to entertain and instruct these press boys from the east of Oregon and the Pacific Northwest. On the return of these editors and writers to their homes they will carry in their mind's eye thoughts of Oregon, many of which will be given expression to in newspapers and magazines. This will furnish Oregon with a big advertisement and attract attention to the state's resources that will be worth thousands of dollars to her varied interests. The bringing of these representatives of the national press to Portland and Oregon is due to the activity of the passenger department of the Oregon Railway & Navigation Company, and the benefits arising from their coming can be credited to the management of that railroad.—East Oregonian.
